Autism and Beauty Therapy



One of our Support Workers here in Central has had an article published in a magazine for beauty therapists! Susan Norman has worked at Balmyre for four years now where she provides holistic beauty therapy for the individuals we support in addition to her role as a Support Worker.

Susan, who runs Bliss at Balmyre, offers a range of free treatments each lasting around 15 minutes. Bliss was set up to enhance the lives of individuals by offering a personalised salon experience, which benefits their mind, body and spirit. Many adults with autism find it difficult to access these salon treatments within the community; Bliss offers them this opportunity.

Susan explains: "For people with autism, accessing an experience that most take for granted can be difficult for a number of reasons. The work I do really makes a difference – from the thrill of verbally choosing a treatment off the treatment list, to just having their face touched during a facial."

New Service for Adults with Autism in Central

We are delighted to announce that we are planning to open a new residential service in Alloa in 2018 for adults with autism. The new service will provide accommodation for up to nine autistic adults and include six self-contained flats, all with en-suite facilities.

As the individuals we support get older, their needs change over time and additional health and mobility issues add new challenges. The aim of this new service is to provide accommodation which meets the specific care needs of adults with autism who may live with other health-related issues such as arthritis, limited mobility and sight loss.

Angela Steele, Senior Autism Practitioner, said: "As people get older, the risk is that individuals become socially isolated or have to move into a non autism-specific care setting to meet their physical needs. With this new service, we want to create an environment that is fit for purpose now but can also be adapted for the future."

The property will be all on one level with private accommodation and communal social areas. Enlarged door openings and en-suite shower rooms are just some of the adaptations that will be made. There is also a large mature garden which we are hoping to transform for use by all residents.

Having invested in the building, we are currently fundraising for the cost of upgrading the interior and outside areas of the residence and are really excited for this fantastic new service to open next year.

Saturday: 10am - 4pm (April - August)


