Our 50th Anniversary and Christmas Celebrations

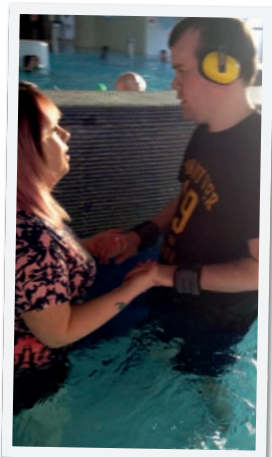
